2. No one can be older than 18 to enter the Junior Agriculture Division.
3. No contestant will be allowed more than one entry in the same class but may enter open classes.
4. Entries may be mailed to the Entry Office, New Mexico State Fair, Gate 4 - 300 San Pedro Blvd. NE, Albuquerque, New Mexico 87108 - (505) 222-9700. Freight and express charges must be prepaid. Exhibit should be carefully packed, with list of contents and full instructions on outside of package and must arrive no later than Wednesday, September 9th.
5. Upon presentation of claim checks, all exhibits will be released only on **Monday, September 28th, 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM**. Any exhibits remaining on the Fairgrounds after the designated pick up date of September 28, 2009 will be considered abandoned and shall become the property of the New Mexico State Fair to be disposed of at its discretion.
6. Exhibitor recognizes that marketing of the Fair and its grounds requires use of photography and video. Exhibitor hereby expressly grants to the Fair the irrevocable, assignable right and license to take, use and publish exhibitor images and property without the need for any other approval.
