How to Enter

- A. Enter online at www.dukesofale.com. Completed entry forms along with a check or money order should be placed in an envelope and rubber banded to one of the entry bottles. Make checks payable to "Dukes of Ale". A \$7.00 entry fee will be charged for each Amateur Entry and \$8.00 entry will be charged for each Professional Entry

- B. At least two bottles per entry must be submitted. Three bottles are preferred. If only two bottles are submitted the beer may not be available for the Best of Show judging. All bottles must be at least 12 ounces and be made of brown glass. Since the judging is intended to be blind, the bottles must in no way be distinctive. Thus, all labels must be completely removed. The bottle must not have any distinctive raised lettering or painted markings. Non-standard bottle shapes (eg. Negro Modelo bottles) should not be used.

Any markings on bottle caps must be completely obscured using "permanent" black marker. No Plastic or swing-top "Grolsch" bottles will be accepted. While corks may be used for some ciders and meads, the bottles should still be capped. Entrants cannot enter more than one beer per sub-class.

- C. Completed bottle I. D. forms must be attached to each bottle with a rubber band. **DO NOT** attach bottle I.D. with tape.
- D. Deadline for entries is Saturday, August 7, 2010. No late entries will be accepted.
- E. Volunteers wishing to help with the competition or who desire to know more about beer, and the art and science of brewing are encouraged to notify one of the contacts listed below.
- F. All entries shall become the property of the Pro-Am Committee

Who May Enter

Products of commercial breweries/meaderies in New Mexico may only be entered in the Professional Division. Any beer/mead/cider produced in the home by either a professional or amateur brewer in New Mexico, may be entered in the Amateur Division. All amateur entries must be made in the home.

Judging

Judging will take place on Saturday and Sunday August 21 and August 22, 2010 as necessary. Potential judges and stewards should contact the appropriate person listed below.

The BJCP 50 point scoring system will be employed to judge beers.

Awards

Medals will be awarded based on an entry's placement (1st, 2nd, or 3rd) in each style and possibly Sub-style depending on the number of entries. Placement medals will be awarded at the discretion of the judges provided a minimum score of 25 is achieved. In addition to the placement medals, ribbons for Beer Best of Show, Best Ale, Best Lager, Mead/Cider Best of Show, Best Mead, and Best Cider will also be awarded for both the Professional and Amateur Divisions. Awards will be available at the September Dukes of Ale meeting (check the web site below for the time and place). Judge's comments/score sheets and awards for entrants will be available at that time. Ribbons won by the Best of Show/Category will be on display at the Agriculture Building on the State Fairgrounds and will not be available to the winners until after the conclusion of the State Fair. Awards ceremony will be held **Saturday, September 11, 2010** at Dead Man's picnic/campground, see website for details. Materials not picked up at the September Dukes of Ale meeting or the awards ceremony will be mailed to the entrant.
