CONTESTANTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING CONTEST RULES

Rules

1. All items must be clean and in excellent condition.
2. Entries are limited to residents of New Mexico.
3. Articles shall be the work of the exhibitor and completed within the last year. Exhibitors must be amateurs. Professionals may submit articles for display purposes only. The articles will **not** be judged.
4. Entries will not be accepted for articles not listed in premium book.
5. No person shall make multiple entries under one class number.
6. "Any Other" means not like a previous entry.
7. All entries shall comply with the size requirements as set forth in the new Mexico State Fair Premium Book. No larger than 3 ft. x 4 ft.
8. Exhibitors who are unable to accompany their exhibits may send them by prepaid express or parcel post. Please address entries being delivered by UPS, FED EX, etc. in care of Expo New Mexico State Fair, Superintendent, Home Arts Center, P. O. Box 8546, Albuquerque, NM 87198. Mailed exhibits should arrive no later than Thursday, September 3rd to assure being judged. Sender's name and address must be plainly written on outside of package. An entry list for each exhibitor must be included in each package of goods shipped so that its contest can be properly checked. Mailed or shipped entries will be returned after the fair provided funds to cover transportation costs are included with their entry.
9. Exhibitors are responsible for picking up their own exhibits or providing written authorization for pick-up by another individual.

10. Tags for the identification of articles will be attached when the article is entered. The claim check portion of the tag must be presented before the articles will be returned at the end of the fair.
11. The judge is instructed to award premiums only to articles deemed worthy of merit. All items must be clean and in excellent condition to be considered for judging.
12. Exhibits Entered During the Fair Time: Exhibitors may drive through Gate #4 to the Home Arts Building between 8:00 AM and 9:00 AM to unload and enter exhibits. After 9:00 AM exhibitors must park in Lot #4 and walk entries to the Home Arts Building. Contestants arriving or staying after 9:00 AM will be charged for parking. There will be no driving on Main Street after 9:00 AM. After entering exhibits, if exhibitor intends to stay on the grounds, exhibitor must move vehicle to parking lots #1, #8 or #9 and pay parking fee.
13. In order to safeguard against loss in this department, no one, with the exception of the judge and the superintendent, will be permitted to handle any article when once put in place. Every precaution will be taken for the safety of all entries but in no case will the New Mexico State Fair or State of New Mexico be responsible for loss or damages to any entry when it is in the Fair's possession.
14. Exhibitor recognizes that marketing of the Fair and its grounds requires use of photography and video. Exhibitor hereby expressly grants to the Fair the irrevocable, assignable right and license to take, use and publish exhibitor images and property without the need for any other approval.
