Entry Fee

Entry fees for each animal are \$20.00 (late fees if applicable) and must accompany the entry. Parking permit, Office, and Exhibitor Pass fees must also accompany the entry.

Arrival / Departure

Begins at noon on Sept. 14th, but must be on grounds by Sept. 15th at 5:00 pm. Departure at conclusion of show.

Special rules

1. Red Angus Association of America, 4201 N I-35, Denton, TX 76207, (940) 387-3502. Registered Red Angus Cattle, including Category I-A (100%) and Category I-B (87%-99%) will be eligible to show.
2. This show will be conducted under a joint provision where Category I-A and Category I-B show together in the same classes.
3. Entries in classes at any Red Angus Show are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the Red Angus Association of America with reference to general regulations, ownership requirements, the declaration of participation, performance information, right to appeal, protests, breeding show classifications, and show classifications.
4. This also will include inspection of entries, such as blood typing, mouthing and such other inspections prescribed by the Red Angus Association of America.

New Mexico Livestock Board Rules

- Proof of ownership (NMLB “form 1” inspection certificate) must accompany the animal when traveling out of district and is strongly recommended even in district. This will help assure that all requirements are met well before fair time.
- Brands:
 1. All show cattle must be branded with a New Mexico registered brand; if not that of the brand’s registered owner, a bill-of-sale and a letter of permission from the brand’s owner is required.
 2. Fresh brands are not allowed – the brand must be “peeled and healed”.
 3. A freeze brand does not qualify as a New Mexico registered brand.
 4. Certificates of Brand Exemption are allowed only on registered breeding cattle under that ownership. Exempt cattle must have breed registry tattoo. Steers do not qualify for a Certificate of Brand Exemption.
- All breeding bulls require a negative trichomoniasis test.
- All cattle, steers and sexually intact, 4 months and older, require a negative TB test prior to showing.
- Sexually intact cattle: within 60 days of any exhibition, including the New Mexico State Fair
 1. If a nursing cow-calf pair, the test will be on the cow.
 2. Accredited TB Free Herd status will be recognized

No copies or faxed copies of TB test charts or health certificates will be accepted unless signed by the veterinarian in blue ink certifying the copy.

This information is provided only as a guide and may not contain all necessary requirements for livestock bound for exhibits and shows. It is extremely important to consult your Livestock Inspector for updated information well ahead of your planned date of transport.

New Mexico has been downgraded in Bovine Tuberculosis Status, being classified as having an increased risk for Bovine Tuberculosis throughout the state. USDA’s, and neighboring states’ - expectation for diligence throughout New Mexico will continue, regardless of the proposed establishment of a Modified Accredited Advanced, or Split State, status. New Mexico must maintain a high level of surveillance in order to (1) demonstrate minimization of the potential for spread of TB, (2) insure buyers are receiving disease free animals, (3) prevent putting out-of-state animals at risk, and (4) preserve the confidence of all states in the stream of commerce that receive New Mexico cattle.

Because of the high level of intermingling of livestock at fairs, all bovine exhibition cattle will be required to show evidence of a negative tuberculosis skin test prior to exhibition. The New Mexico Livestock Board will assist in whatever ways available to help make this process as simple and feasible as possible.

\$20.00 Entry

47. Senior Get-of-Sire. Four animals by the same sire, both sexes represented, need not be owned by the exhibitor. All animals must have been shown in their respective classes.
48. Junior Get-of-Sire. Three animals by the same sire, both sexes represented, need not be owned by the exhibitor. Entries must have been calved on or after Sept. 1, 2008. All animals must have been shown in their respective classes.
49. Produce-of-Dam. Two animals, either or both sexes, both shown in their respective classes. Animals shown in this class need not be owned by the exhibitor.
50. Premier Breeders Class. Will be computed from breeder's placement in individual classes only as follows: 3 points for each 1st; 2 points for each 2nd, 1 point for each 3rd. Maximum number of placements to be used to determine winner shall be limited to 5. Calculated on breeders of animals for exhibitors only. (In case of a tie, the next highest individual class placement will be used to determine the winner.)

51. Premier Exhibitors Class. Will be computed from exhibitor's placement in individual classes only as follows: 3 pts for each 1st; 2 pts for each 2nd; 1 pt for each 3rd. Maximum number of placements to be used to determine winner shall be limited to 5 (in case of tie, the next highest individual class placement will be used to determine the winner)

Junior Red Angus

Eligibility / Rules

1. Open to in-state and out-of-state youth.
2. Please see Open Red Angus Rules for Judging Information and Entry Fees listed at the beginning of this document.
3. Classes will be determined after all entries are assembled at the show location, and care will be exercised to ensure a minimum spread in age of animals within any individual class.
4. Animals entered must be registered in the name of the junior exhibitor and must have been under the ownership of the junior member or a member of the immediate family of the junior member for a period of not less than 60 days prior to the date of the show.
5. All junior heifer entries will be eligible for competition in the open show. Entries in the junior heifer show must conform to the General Regulations pertaining to entries in open shows and are subject to all inspections applicable to open show entries.
